That is, you need your own NES game ROMs. Changes to your NES Classic expire the warranty and you can damage the console. Add new games at your peril. Before you start, you should have your ROMs at hand. To add games to your NES Classic: you can use them to add games to an SNES Classic with the Hakchi2 software. Nintendo-Entertainment-System-NES-Controller-FR.jpg When the console is turned off, connect your NES Classic to a PC using a USB cable, Your progress. If your PC is having trouble detecting your NES Classic, try using a USB cable other than the one included in the console. Download the latest version of Hakchi2. If it comes in a ZIP file, extract the content to your PC. Open hakchi.exe (the icon is a NES controller). If you are prompted to download additional resources and restart your device, continue and reopen hakchi.exe after restarting. Select NES (USA/Europe). Select Add more games to upload the ROMs you want to add to your NES Classic. Only files with the extension .NES works, although you can also upload ZIP folders that contain them. In the Custom Games list, select the title you want to add cover art to. Select Google to get images directly from Google. On the Hakchi2 toolbar, select Kernel > Install/Repair, and then select Yes when asked if you want to flash the custom kernel. Follow the instructions that appear. You may need to install some drivers if they are not installed automatically if you have the console connected. When the process is complete, select Synchronize Selected Games with NES/SNES Mini and confirm that you have flashed the custom kernel. After the ROMs finish uploading, turn off the console and disconnect it from your PC. Connect the power source to your NES Classic and turn it on. Your new games are located in a folder called New Games next to the pre-installed titles. To add more games, connect the NES Classic to your PC, open Hakchi and select Sync Selected Games with NES/SNES Mini. It is not necessary to flash the custom kernel every time. Long before the NES Classic came out, gamers had already played their favorite Nintendo titles thanks to emulators and ROMs. Downloading ROMs from games you don't already own is not technically legal; However, it is often easier to find ROMs for NES games online than to find physical copies of old games. With approximately 300 MB of unused internal memory, the NES Classic offers plenty of space for ROMs. Box art images are usually larger than the actual game files, so you can skip them to make room for even more games. ROM is not a file extension; It is a broad term for a file type. NES-ROMs usually have the extension .nes.
